






READ

The five steps in this guide will help you learn how to read and understand the Bible more so you can grow closer to God.

1. Find a translation you understand

The Bible was written in three ancient languages. Each translation into modern languages represents years of work to help you process the Bible in a way that makes sense.

2. Pick a time and a place

Are you a morning person or night owl? Do you like quiet places or bustling coffee shops? Do you learn by watching, listening, or reading? Do you sometimes read paper and other times digital?

3. Uncover the context- its the key!

Think like a detective and discover the story behind the story. The Bible is a collection of 66 different books, written in three languages, across three continents, over a 1,500-year period by 40 different authors. Use tools like these to learn who the text was written to, when, where, and why.

THE BIBLE DOESN'T NEED TO BE REWRITTEN -**IT NEEDS TO RE-READ!**







GOD'S WORD COMES TO US IN SEVERAL FORMS NOT JUST THE WRITTEN WORD:

1. GOD'S DECREES: HIS AUTHORITATIVE COMMANDS

• Genesis 1:3 "Let there be light" • Psalm 33:6 "By the word of the Lord the heavens were made."

CENTRAL TRUTH: These decrees demonstrate God's sovereign power to bring His will, create and sustain the universe through spoken word.



2. GOD'S WORDS OF PERSONAL ADDRESS:

These are instances where God speaks directly to individuals, providing guidance, commands, revelations, direction.

• Genesis 2:16-17: "And the Lord God commanded the man, saying, 'You may surely eat of every tree of the garden..." Exodus 3:14: "God said to Moses, 'I AM WHO I AM."

CENTRAL TRUTH: These personal addresses highlight God's relational nature and His desire to communicate directly with His creation.





3. GOD'S WORDS SPOKEN THROUGH HUMAN LIPS:

Prophets and other individuals speak God's words: Moses, Samuel, and Jeremiah, conveying God's message to the people.

- **Exodus 4:12:** "Now therefore go, and I will be with your mouth and teach you what you shall speak."
- Jeremiah 1:9: "Then the Lord put out his hand and touched my mouth. And the Lord said to me, 'Behold, I have put my words in your mouth.'"
- **CENTRAL TRUTH:** God can use human vessels to communicate His divine message, ensuring that His word is faithfully delivered.





4. GOD'S WORDS SPOKEN THROUGH JESUS:

Jesus is referred to as "the Word," revealing God to humanity.

- John 1:1: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God."
- John 1:14: "And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us." **Revelation 19:13:** "He is clothed in a robe dipped in blood, and the name by which he is called is The Word of God."

CENTRAL TRUTH: These passages affirm that Jesus is the ultimate revelation of God, embodying God's message to humanity.





THE CANON OF SCRIPTURE - The term "canon" comes from the Greek word "kanon," meaning "rule" or "measuring stick"

- The "canon" or collection of Scripture is the recognised books of Scripture (recognised, NOT INVENTED by the church)
- Up to 400 AD various official gatherings of church leaders (councils) from all over the Christian world meeting to discuss various issues of teaching and church practice and make binding decisions for the church at large. The councils were made up of Christians from throughout the Roman
- Empire and then further abroad.
- The councils followed followed principles to determine whether a New Testament book was truly inspired by the Holy Spirit:





Principles the Councils used to determine whether a New Testament book was truly inspired by the Holy Spirit:

1) Was the author an apostle or have a close connection with an apostle?

2) Is the book being accepted by the body of Christ at large?


3) Did the book contain consistency of doctrine and orthodox teaching?

4) Did the book bear evidence of high moral and spiritual values that would reflect a work of the Holy Spirit?
