Prayer Begins with Friendship with God

(Genesis 18:16-19)







God shares His plans with Abraham because they have a covenant *relationship*.







 For children/youth: Prayer is like talking to a close friend. Holy Spirit helps us to pray (Romans 8:26)

 For adults: Cultivate time with God so prayer becomes natural, not formal duty.

• 2 Cor 13:14 "Fellowship with the Holy Spirit" - an ongoing close relationship & partnership







Prayer Flows from Compassion for Others

(Genesis 18:20-22)

We are often called to pray for people different from us—across cultures, beliefs, practises. We need compassion to do that, we need to see with eyes beyond our own perspectives.







Pray for others, especially those we might otherwise forget—nations in conflict, veterans, refugees.

Nigerian situation







Abraham's prayer reminds us to intercede for nations in conflict and for leaders seeking peace.

Prayer Is Bold but Humble (Genesis 18:23–30)

Abraham respectfully intercedes with God, showing both boldness and humility.
