1 THE BEAUTY OF GOD'S GIVING IS SEEN IN A FATHER WHO SENDS LIGHT INTO DARKNESS

Luke 1:76–79

The world is described as:

- *Darkness*
 - *The shadow of death*
 - *Lost without guidance*

- Into this world, God gives us **“the rising sun from heaven”** (v. 78).
 - God responds to darkness not with judgement but with **the gift of His son.**

THE BEAUTY OF GOD'S GIVING IS SEEN IN THE PEOPLE HE SENDS Luke 1:76–79

God gave John the Baptist — A Messenger to Prepare the Way

- Zechariah speaks to his son: *“And you, my child, will be called a prophet...”*
- John is a gift of preparation, a human gift to help others find Jesus.
- God often blesses us through *people*: encouragers, leaders, friends, family, spiritual guides.

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GOD GAVE JESUS — THE GIFT OF GOD HIMSELF

- Jesus doesn't bring light—the Light.

THE BEAUTY OF GOD'S GIVING IS SEEN IN WHY JESUS IS THE GREATEST GIFT

Luke 1:76–79

HE CAME TO GIVE US KNOWLEDGE OF SALVATION (V. 77)

- Not guesswork.
- Not uncertainty.
- Not fear.

A gift of clarity and assurance:

- You can be forgiven
- You can live free
- You can be accepted in Christ

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HE CAME TO SHINE LIGHT INTO EVERY HIDDEN CORNER (V. 79A)

Light for:

- The grieving
- The lonely
- Immigrants far from home
- The exhausted
- The depressed
- The spiritually searching
- His light does not expose us to shame

to bring healing.

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HE CAME TO GUIDE OUR FEET INTO THE PATH OF PEACE (V. 79B)

- Peace with God
- Peace within ourselves
- Peace across cultures, families, and communities
